On the following pages, I will show some of the elements that I think are important to consider including in your own photography.


These three pictures were all taken in the Holy Land. The picture on the left is from Petra in Jordan, and the structure is called "The Treasury."




# focus




### contrast


One of the most powerful elements of photography is contrast. You can play with contrast with light and shadow; color or black and white; mess, and organization, showing a subject, or the absence thereof.
